## ***Highlights***

### **The Institute provides:**

- Practical training that includes the requirement in each class for participants to engage in classroom observations and/or volunteer or professional teaching for approximately ten hours per course.

- A career pathway for increased employment opportunities in the field of TESOL that include adult education programs at nonprofits, government educational, businesses, and overseas organizations.

### **The Institute requires:**

- A bachelor's degree as a prerequisite to admission
- A deep commitment to providing quality instruction for ESOL learners
- A significant willingness and preparedness to engage in challenging academic work
- A commitment of personal time, energy, and resources
- Successful completion of the four core noncredit classes, each running 40 hours, in
  - Methods of Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages
  - Assessment and Evaluation in the ESOL Classroom
  - Teaching Reading Skills to ESOL Learners
  - Understanding Second Language Acquisition
- Successful completion of approximately ten hours of classroom observations and/or teaching per course.
- Completion of all classes with a grade of "B" or higher in order to earn a Certificate of Completion.

Additional coursework may be added to the program as the needs are identified.
