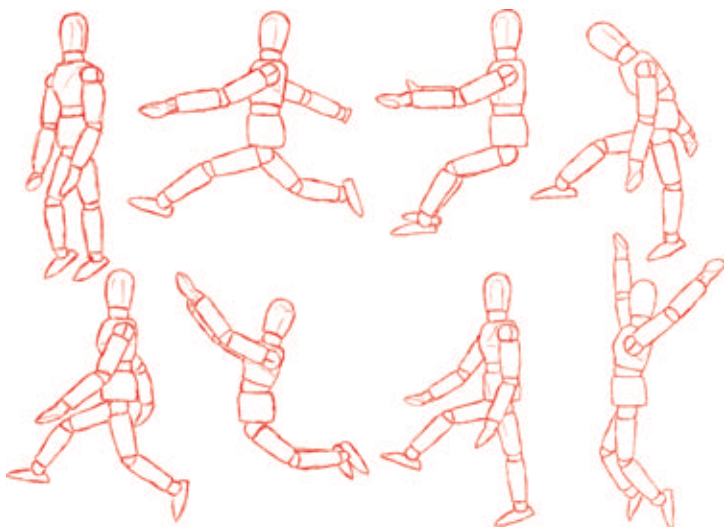

Tuition Waiver

Only noncredit courses designated “tuition waiver applies” in each publication will be available for tuition waiver for Maryland State residents. This statement appears in each applicable course description. Only tuition is waived; required fees must be paid by the student.

Senior Tuition Waiver: Individuals 60 years or older by the start date of the class may have tuition waived.

Disability Tuition Waiver: Does not apply to non-credit courses. For further information please see <http://cms.montgomerycollege.edu/EDU/department2.aspx?id=32936>.

National Guard Tuition Waiver: If you are currently a member of the Maryland National guard and are enlisted for at least a 24-month period, you are eligible for a 50 percent tuition waiver. You must submit proof of such from the adjutant general’s office. Documents must be received at time of registration.

Refund Policy

The refund deadline date is equivalent to 6% of the number of times a course meets. Refunds are paid at 100 percent for courses dropped in writing on or before the date printed on the confirmation.
